3.3.6 - Taking of Pounds Sensibly

Gloria Gale spoke representing TOPS chapter #1743. She said they are a health chapter that helps people with their health and weight issues and they are recommended by Doctors. She also said they are a nonprofit organization and has been at WC for 6 months previously holding their meetings at Noble Creek Community Center but could not afford \$50.00 per hour to stay at Noble Creek. She said the Woman's club is unsafe because it is dark when they arrive and dark when they leave and there are 4 or 5 people who hang around there at night sometimes when they leave. Although the District provides security guards they haven't been there the last 2 weeks and the week prior to that they stayed in their car. The old security guard, Sheldon was very nice and helpful but the new ones are not. She would like to be moved back to Noble Creek because the temperature was 63 degrees in the room last night. The bathrooms are nasty and the homeless are hanging around at the doors. She said she is willing to negotiate the price. Chairman Flores said they will entertain her request and asked her to meet with the General Manger. He also

stated there is no longer a special rate for nonprofit groups unless the group can give the appropriate paperwork to the GM and the group is a benefit to our community. She will call Duane to set up a meeting. John invited her to the next facilities ad hoc meeting to give a presentation of her organization. John provided his cell number to her and asked her to call him if she ever gets to the Woman's Club doesn't feel safe.

4. DEPARTMENT REPORTS:

Human Resources Administrator/Clerk of the Board: Janet Covington

Janet reported there have not been any new hires or departed employees. The District has 32 employees. She said each Board member was provided in their board package the Special District Board Member handbook for their review and she has the Roberts Rules of Order in her office for the Directors review. She also provided each Director their Statement of Economic Interest for the annual reporting requirement and asked them to return it by the February 14, 2018 board meeting. She reported there have not been any workers compensation cases and there is no update on the accident claim of 8/2016. She reported the Safety Compliance Company provided "Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals" training on December 27, 2017. Janet reported that Aaron Morris received 3 certificates of achievements in Arborist Technician, Pest Management and Turf Grass Management. Aaron also received the "Employee of the Year" award. David Alonzo received the "Part Timer of the Year" Award. Rodrigo Camacho received the "Make it Happen" award and Nancy law received the "General Managers Choice" award as well as the "Directors Choice" award. Five employees received a "5 Years of Service" awards: David Alonzo, Alyssa Fuimaono,

Alainah Ortiz, Nick Hughes and Dodie Carlson. Janet also reminded the Directors of the Installation dinner on Thursday, January 25th starting at 5:30 at Tukwet.

Financial Services Technician/Office Manager: Nancy Law

Nancy reported the finance committee met on January 8, 2018 and reviewed the December financials. Nancy was not able to attend but she responded to all questions. She reported she received property tax disbursements for November and December after the finance meeting. She stated she transferred \$3,000.00 into the Reserve Fund for a balance of \$200,102.29. Nancy reported she received both Fire camp checks for a total of \$31,000.00 (\$19,000.00 for the Mias Fire and \$12,000.00 for the Palmer Fire). Nancy has requested the Laura May Stewart grant package. Nancy stated the Facility Use License agreements and contract instructor agreements were completed and the dates are on the calendars. She also said she is working with Jessica Warrick on our social Media featuring our programs and classes to help get class enrollments ups.

Athletic Coordinator: Dodie Carlson

Dodie wished everyone a Happy New Year and reported we are booked for tournaments thru July. She said Winterball season will be starting the last weeks of January and she has a lot of new teams coming in.

Activities Coordinator: Amy Minjares

Amy said she has toured all the Districts facilities to get familiar with them. She said she is working on the next two events which are the Welcome Home Vietnam Veteran's event on February 29th and Spring Fling event on March 31st She passed out a flyer for the Welcome Home Vietnam Veterans event.

Maintenance Foreman: Frank Flores

Frank wished everyone a Happy New Year. He reported they have fixed various main lines and have been replacing valves. They have installed DG to the dog park walkways and wood chips in the Dog Park. CDF worked with staff to take down the Christmas lights at the Grange and he reported the FIOS line conduit has been installed from the Thunder Alley Restrooms over to the maintenance building and is scheduled to be installed in the coming weeks. He said he can't wait to meet with Amy to review this year's events and he stated the water drained very well throughout the park.

Background and Analysis:

In May of 2016 the Board of Directors approved a conceptual Master Plan for the expansion of Noble Creek Park located at 390 Oak Valley Parkway. The District currently uses the 2006 Master Plan, which was approved by the Board in 2006 also the City of Beaumont identified this Master Plan in their Regional Park Impact Fee. As a result, the City collected a Park Fee on behalf of the District and passed 12% of the Regional Park Impact fee on to the District for projects at Noble Creek Park. These Projects were constructed from 2006-2010 at the Park. Consequently, funds collected by the City for projects at Noble Creek Park have exceeded the amount identified in the City's Regional Park fee report.

Currently demand for the Noble Creek Park exceeds the supply of fields and facilities and the City is growing in population at a record pace. As a result, the District now needs to consider adopting their own Developer Impact fee for expanding Noble Creek Park to mitigate the demands of facilities.

Recently, there have been administrative changes at the District and the City. With that said, our District Board has decided to work with the City to administer and update the 2006 Master Plan with a new 2018 Master Plan and consider adopting their own Developer Impact Fee to expand the Park to facilitate expansion.

The District contracted with TBLA Architects and David Taussig and Associates to develop and implement a New Master Plan with an associated development impact fee.

Recommendations: Staff recommends Board direction and community input, set dates for future workshops, public hearing.

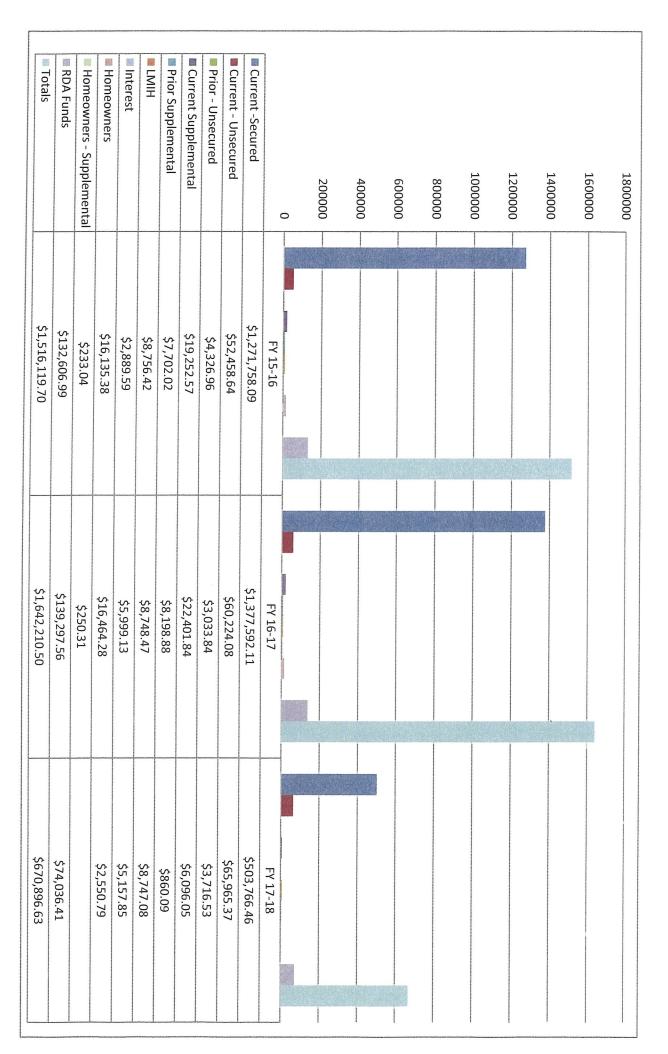

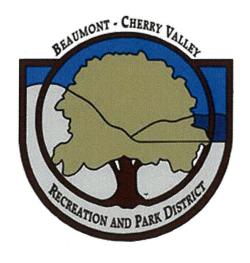

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01. Introduction & Background

In 2006 the Beaumont Cherry-Valley Park and Recreation District adopted a Park Facilities Master Plan for the communities served by the District. In 2006 it was estimated that district served a community of 17,275. In the years from 2006 to 2017 the population of Beaumont has grown at a rate of around 2,000 each year. The growing communities within the district continue to place increasing demands for sports, recreation and community events at the district facilities.

An analysis of the population make-up shows the largest population groups within the district to be 25 to 30, 31 to 35, and 36 to 40. This is significant because these are the ages in which families are actively raising children. This population trend has been consistent during the period of 2011 to 2014 and can be assumed will continue. The growing families within the district have children ranging from pre-school through high school.

In addition to the increase of adolescent, the district has an active adult population. Currently the district provides a wide variety of recreation activities for retired adults, working adults, men, women and youth.

The national park and recreation organizations show that popular recreational trends fall into several categories. First there are several sports and recreation activities which remain consistent in popularity such as softball, baseball, basketball, martial arts, soccer and walking. Second; here are other sports and activities which fall in and out of popularity such as tennis. The third category is those recreation trends which are growing in popularity. These new recreation / sports interests include an increased focus on adult exercise classes such ad yoga, Zumba, palates and various forms of dance as well as self-defense and personal fitness classes are popular with adults and youth. The desire for diverse youth sports actives continues, with increasing interest is lacrosse and rugby.

In addition physical to active sports and recreation activities, the desire for recreation districts to fill the gaps for art and music classes remains. Another growing need is the provision to provide outdoor spaces for events such as weddings, reunions, corporate training events and other such functions.

The Franco garden at Noble creek Park is a popular venue for these activates. The grounds and facility of the Cherry-Valley Grange have the potential to be developed as an events venue. The desire for rental facilities will continue.

Future population increases will require the expansion and improvements of park and community recreation facilities. The desire for increased diversity of activities, sports and



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fitness events calls for continued partnerships with school districts, adjacent cities and the county.

An increasing populations and growing desires for diverse recreation activities will continue to impact the ability of district facilities to meet recreation needs.

02. Trends of Popular Sports and Recreation Activities

Recreation and fitness trends within the United States are guided by an increased health and fitness concerns regarding childhood obesity, life longevity and quality of life. Recreation trends are putting an increased focus on fitness and social interactive classes, health life styles and diversity of sports and recreation activities.

Pathway and trail walking/hiking remains the most popular outdoor activity for adults. Cycling also remains a popular recreation activity among young adults and is a growing activity with retiring and seniors. The fastest growing trend in cycling is the interest in mountain biking.

With the baby boomer population reaching retirement or in retirement and with a growing interest in maintaining a healthy active life style, the popularity of senior sports leagues, senior fitness and healthy life style classes and age group socially interactive activities. Interest in senior softball leagues, yoga, Zumba, dance and walking groups is on the increase.

The growing concern regarding adolescent obesity has given support for after school sports leagues and activity. Life style activities may include walking, cycling, fitness training, and physically active games and cope course interaction are growing in popularity. Health and recreation professionals encourage a mix of team (socially interactive) sports and recreation activities as well as invaluably fitness training.

With such diversity in recreation trends, it is essential that park districts, school districts, and other recreational agencies to provide a diverse spectrum of recreation sports and recreation.

In addition to the increased interest in health and fitness, there is a growing focus to the provision of parks and open spaces where children and adults can interact with nature. Popular activities include bird watching, hiking or walking in open space areas and day use such as picnics, BBQ's and outdoor games.

The National Recreation and Parks Association for the year 2017 rakes the following activities according predict the following:

An increasing volume of evidence indicates that people who live close to parks have an increase in life longevity.



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The importance of the preservation and conservation of park and importance and value as cities and communities grow and develop.

The trends which look for a greater diversity of sports, fitness, and wellness activities well have significant challenges to recreation districts. It is not feasible or practical for a community or district to provide every facet of recreation. In consideration of funding and facility limitations recreation programs must be selected to provide the best benefit for the largest group possible.

To provide a practical diverse recreation BCVRPD has partnered with the Beaumont Unified School District, the Cities of Beaumont, Banning and Calimesa and with County of Riverside. It will be essential for the district to continue to partner with these entities in the future to provide a diverse sports and recreation program.

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04. Trails

The creation and extension of the path and trails systems within Noble Creek Park are intended to become part of an interconnecting path and trails systems in the Cities of Beaumont, Banning, and Calimesa and in the pass area of Riverside County. Beyond the trails systems of the cities and country are the trail systems of the San Bernardino Mountain park system including segment of the John Meyer trail system.

San Jacinto Trails & San Jacinto Parks

Find trails near San Jacinto California, including San Jacinto parks, San Jacinto walks and San Jacinto bike paths.

<u>San Jacinto Peak (The Middle Way - Idyllwild, CA):</u> The San Jacinto Mountains, like many other units of the Peninsular Ranges (and much of the Sierra Nevada to the north) have gradually sloping west slopes and more steeply plunging east faces.

<u>San Jacinto Peak (Palm Springs, CA):</u> This rewarding trip surveys some of the best highmountain country southern California has to offer and ends on a lofty summit that affords perhaps the finest vistas in the region.

<u>San Jacinto Peak from Idyllwild (San Jacinto Peak, CA):</u> This trip is our favorite tour of the San Jacinto Wilderness high country.

<u>South Fork Trail (San Jacinto River) (Idyllwild, CA):</u> This trail combines great views of the San Jacinto Mountains from a lovely promontory with a wonderful descent into a lush canyon, complete with wildlife and fishing opportunities.

San Jacinto Peak (The Easy Way) (Palm Springs, CA): San Jacinto Peak is a close second after San Gorgonio Mountain on the roster of Southern California high points, but its more sharply defined and imposing bulk makes it instantly identifiable from almost anywhere.

<u>San Jacinto Peak (Backpacking)</u> (<u>Palm Springs, CA):</u> The north face of San Jacinto Peak, at one point soaring 9000 feet up in four horizontal miles, is one of the most imposing escarpments in the United States.

<u>San Jacinto Peak: (The Hard Way) (Palm Springs, CA):</u> This hike, known as the Cactus-to-Clouds Hike by Palm Springs hiking enthusiasts, is an absolute hoot—if you survive.

<u>San Jacinto Peak (San Jacinto Peak, CA):</u> The north face of San Jacinto Peak, at one point soaring 9000 feet up in four horizontal miles, is one of the most imposing escarpments in the U.S.



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<u>San Jacinto Peak via Fuller Ridge (San Jacinto Peak, CA):</u> The Pacific Crest Trail (PCT) follows Fuller Ridge northwest from San Jacinto Peak. The long dirt road by which you arrived reaches the trail at 7720 feet, the highest point to which you can drive on the mountain.

<u>San Jacinto Peak via the Marion Mtn. Trail (Idyllwild, CA):</u> The Marion Mtn. Trail on the western flank of San Jacinto is the shortest route to the summit without taking the tram.

<u>Seven Peaks of the San Jacinto Wilderness (San Jacinto Peak, CA):</u> This challenging trip explores all of the officially named summits of the San Jacinto high country; visiting the summits of Marion Mtn., Jean Peak, Newton Drury Peak, Folly Peak, San Jacinto, Miller Peak, and Cornell Peak.

<u>San Jacinto Loop (Backpacking)</u> (<u>Palm Desert, CA</u>):_At 10,804 feet, San Jacinto Peak is one of the three tallest major summits ringing the Los Angeles Basin.

<u>San Jacinto Peak (Idyllwild, CA):</u> Clean, white granite boulders, rock climbing, fabulous views. And the largest pine cones you'll probably ever see.

<u>San Jacinto Peak Trail (Palm Springs, CA):</u> The first 2.5 miles of this out-and-back hike are a gradual climb through pine forest and grassy meadows to Round Valley Campground.

North Fork of the San Jacinto River (San Jacinto Peak, CA):_The San Jacinto River is fed by small springs dotting the upper reaches of the mountain, which coalesce and flow down the west side.

<u>San Jacinto Peak from the Palm Springs Aerial Tramway (San Jacinto Peak, CA):</u> This is the easiest route to the summit of San Jacinto, but it is still a strenuous and rewarding.

<u>San Jacinto via Fuller Ridge (Cabazon, CA):</u> Fuller Ridge Trail starts high on the rugged northwest slope of San Jacinto.

<u>Palms to Pines Scenic Drive (Banning to Palm Desert via Idyllwild, CA):</u> A sixty-six-mile-long, two-lane highway that climbs from Banning over the scenic San Jacinto Mountains and down into Palm Desert in the Coachella Valley.

<u>Black Mountain Trail (Banning, CA):</u> The San Jacinto region is a favorite of many Southern Californians.

<u>Warner Springs to San Gorgonio Pass: (Warner Springs, CA):</u> The San Jacinto Mountains are the high point—and the highlight—of the Pacific Crest Trail's excursion through the northern Peninsular Ranges, and they afford the first true high-mountain air and scenery of your journey.



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<u>Vargas Palms (Cabazon, CA):</u> This hike crosses the desert flats north of the San Jacinto Mountains to reach an isolated palm oasis. Highlights included superb views of the dramatic rise from San Gorgonio Pass to the summits of the San Jacinto's.

<u>Kitching Peak (Banning, CA):</u> This fine day hike leads to a panoramic viewpoint on the edge of the wildest mountain country in southern California. Kitching Peak stands like a great throne overlooking the San Gorgonio Pass country.

<u>Pyramid Peak Trail (Hemet, CA):</u> Pyramid Peak lies along a relatively obscure section of the Pacific Crest Trail (PCT) known as the Desert Divide.

<u>Lion Peak Trail (Pinyon Pines, CA):</u> The trip to Lion Peak is an excellent outing along a particularly wild and wonderful section of the San Jacinto Range known as the Desert Divide.

<u>Red Tahquitz (Idyllwild, CA):</u> This rewarding trip visits the highlights of the San Jacinto Mountains' rich forests and verdant meadows, one of the most well-watered and scenic mountain regions of southern California.

<u>Devils Slide Trail to Tahquitz Peak (Fern Valley, CA):</u> The Devils Slide Trail is the second most popular trail in the San Jacinto Wilderness, with only the Palm Springs Tramway Trail to Round Valley and San Jacinto Peak getting more visitors.

<u>Palms to Pines Scenic Byway (Palm Desert, CA):</u> A 67-mile paved route from a desert oasis to the snow-capped forested San Jacinto Mountains.

<u>Devil's Slide Trail (Palm Springs, CA):</u> This is Idyllwild's most popular hike, according to U.S. Forest Service rangers.

<u>Indian Mtn. (Idyllwild, CA):</u> Indian Mtn. is perched amidst the chaparral on the western slopes of the San Jacinto Mountains.

<u>Tahquitz Peak via Saddle Junction (Tahquitz Peak, CA):</u> Tahquitz Peak (8828') is the second major summit in the San Jacinto Mountains after San Jacinto itself.

<u>Tahquitz Peak via the South Ridge Trail (Tahquitz Peak, CA):</u> Tahquitz Peak (8828') is the second major summit in the San Jacinto Mountains after San Jacinto itself. The summit overlooks Idyllwild and is guarded by dramatic granite buttresses, most notably Tahquitz Rock.

<u>Desert View Loop (San Jacinto Peak, CA):</u> This family-friendly hike is an easy introduction to the pleasures of Mt. San Jacinto State Park.

<u>Cactus-to-Clouds (Palm Springs, CA):</u> Cactus-to-Clouds, also known as the Skyline Trail, is a classic Southern California hike. It is the only trail in the United States to directly climb 8000 feet.



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San Gorgonio Mountain Trails & San Gorgonio Mountain Parks

Find trails near San Gorgonio Mountain California, including San Gorgonio Mountain parks, San Gorgonio Mountain walks and San Gorgonio Mountain bike paths.

San Gorgonio Mountain (San Gorgonio Mountain, CA): Bagging the barren, 11,499-foot summit of San Gorgonio Mountain, the highest elevation in California south of the Sierra Nevada, is a quintessential accomplishment for L.A.-area hikers.

<u>San Gorgonio Mountain (Big Bear, CA):</u> The barren, talus-strewn summit of San Gorgonio Mountain (or Greyback, after its steely gray appearance from the valleys below) receives dozens of hikers on most fine-weather weekends.

San Gorgonio Mountain (Mentone, CA): Views from the desert to the Pacific. San Gorgonio

<u>San Gorgonio Wilderness Trails (Morongo, CA):</u> The San Bernardino Mountains aren't your typical desert range. For one, they are well watered and forested.

<u>San Gorgonio Nine Peaks Challenge (San Gorgonio Mountain, CA):</u> The great San Bernardino Divide forms the backbone of San Gorgonio Wilderness and is the highest ridge in California south of the Sierra Nevada.

<u>Anderson Peak (Angelus Oaks, CA):</u> This excellent backpack trip tours the north slopes and high western divides of the San Gorgonio high country, offering many fine places to camp and far-ranging vistas stretching across southern California's wildest mountain country.

<u>Sugarloaf Mountain (Big Bear Lake, CA):</u> This challenging trip leads to the only subalpine summit in the San Bernardino Mountains outside the San Gorgonio Wilderness; from this mountain, inspiring vistas unfold.

<u>Vargas Palms (Cabazon, CA):</u> This hike crosses the desert flats north of the San Jacinto Mountains to reach an isolated palm oasis. Highlights included superb views of the dramatic rise from San Gorgonio Pass to the summits of the San Jacinto's.

San Gorgonio via Vivian Creek (San Gorgonio Mountain, CA): At 11,499 feet, San Gorgonio Mtn. is the tallest summit in Southern California and is an obligatory climb for serious local mountaineers.

<u>San Gorgonio via Dollar and Dry Lakes (San Gorgonio Mountain, CA):</u> This loop up and over San Gorgonio from the north is longer than the Vivian Creek approach, but is arguably even more scenic.

<u>San Bernadino County Campgrounds (San Bernardino, CA):</u> The San Bernardino Mountains span the county from east to west, dividing it roughly in half.



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<u>Black Mountain Road Trail: (Palm Springs, CA):</u> This hike begins about 5 miles outside of Idyllwild Village and follows a wide fire road up a relentless 2,400 feet to a campground and lookout tower with panoramic views of the San Jacinto and San Bernardino Mountains and San Gorgonio Pass

<u>Sugarloaf Mtn. (Big Bear City, CA):</u> The rounded Sugarloaf Mtn. (9952') is the tallest summit in the San Bernardino Mountains outside the San Gorgonio Wilderness.

<u>San Jacinto Peak (The Easy Way: Palm Springs, CA):</u> San Jacinto Peak is a close second after San Gorgonio Mountain on the roster of Southern California high points, but its more sharply defined and imposing bulk makes it instantly identifiable from almost anywhere.

<u>Lion Peak Trail (Pinyon Pines, CA):</u> The trip to Lion Peak is an excellent outing along a particularly wild and wonderful section of the San Jacinto Range known as the Desert Divide.

<u>San Bernardino Peak Trail (Angelus Oaks, CA):</u> San Bernardino Peak is the westernmost high point along the San Bernardino Peak Divide in the San Gorgonio Wilderness, the farthest west of the nine named summits above 10,000 feet in the wilderness area.

<u>Delamar Mountain (Fawnskin, CA):</u> This 10.5-mile loop requires a moderate amount of strength. The ascent, though only steep for the first one-half mile, is steady and 4.5 miles long. The downhill is fast and potholed, requiring good riding technique.

<u>Forsee Creek Trail (Big Bear, CA):</u> Tucked amid the tall, straight trunks of lodge pole pines at nearly 2 miles above sea level, the wind-sheltered and mostly bug-free Trail Fork Camp is a peak bagger's delight.

<u>San Bernardino Mountain Traverse (Backpacking) (Angelus Oaks, CA):</u> The peaked roofline of Southern California's highest watershed divide—San Bernardino Peak to San Gorgonio Mountain—features eight named summits, which are all over 10,000 feet in elevation.

<u>Poopout Hill (Big Bear, CA):</u> Hike to San Bernardino's premier wilderness and take in the fine views of the back side of San Gorgonio Mountain.

Aspen Grove to Fish Creek (Angelus Oaks, CA): The Aspen Grove is one of the San Bernardino Mountains' sweetest gifts. The quaking trees display some of the finest fall color this side of the Rockies.

<u>Delamar Mountain (Fawnskin, CA):</u> This short trip, part cross-country, leads to a tree-crowned viewpoint north of Big Bear Lake. This seldom-visited yet easily accessible mountain, mantled in a pine and fir forest, provides views of Big Bear Lake and the San Gorgonio Wilderness and o...

Jenks Lake (Big Bear, CA): Hike along a beautiful old logging road to a magnificent ten acre mountain lake. Much of the route travels through lush and fertile woodlands. ...



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IMPROVEMENT

Grand View Point (Big Bear Lake, CA): Grand View Point, high on the ridge above Big Bear Lake, offers an unobstructed view across the Santa Ana River Canyon to the tall summits of the San Gorgonio Wilderness.

Riverside County Trails

The County of Riverside has many hiking and cycling trails. Some of the key note trails are as following:

Canyon View Loop Trail

This loop in Whitewater Preserve crosses Whitewater River and incorporates a section of the Pacific Crest Trail to deliver big views up and down Whitewater Canyon. 3.75 miles with 650 feet of elevation change.

Indian Mountain

This out and back hike crosses a saddle to a 5,790-foot summit with views of the mountains around San Jacinto Peak near Idyllwild. 6 miles

San Jacinto Peak via Marion Mountain Trail

This non-nonsense out and back hike ascends to one of Southern California's most panoramic summits, 13.2 miles 4500 feet

Fisherman's Camp

This hike follows an old road to an old campground with views over San Mateo Canyon in the Santa Ana Mountains. 3.33 miles 400 feet

Cities of Beaumont, Calimesa and Banning Trails

The City of Beaumont, Calimesa and Banning have a variety of pedestrian, equestrian, bicycle trails which include several class two and class three bike trails, multi-use trails, walking paths, trails and sidewalks.

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O7 <u>Proposed New Noble Creek Park Improvements</u>

PROPOSED FACILTIES – APPROVED ALTERNATIVE:

The facilities and amenities proposed in the approved Noble Creek Park Master Plan are shown in the proposed north expansion area, which includes the area within SCE Easement and within the drip line SCE Transmission lines. Other improvements are shown throughout the park. The master plan also shows expansions to the Noble Creek Community Center. Planned improvements are outlined by area and described as follows:

The top of the north expansion area includes the development of a tournament ball field. This lighted field is north of the SCE Expansion area. The components of the Tournament Field includes:

- ✓ Installation of water and sewer lines for the proposed restroom facilities, drinking fountains and future community building.
- ✓ Grading,
- ✓ Field and amenity lighting,
- ✓ Backstop, field fencing and dugouts,
- ✓ Flagpoles,
- ✓ Scoreboard,
- ✓ Concrete flatwork, walks and paths,
- ✓ Ballfield artificial turf and irrigation cooling systems,
- \checkmark Turf grass and irrigation systems; and,
- ✓ Bleachers and benches.

Facilities adjacent to the tournament field will include:

- ✓ Creation of a playground / concession / adult exercise area plaza,
- ✓ A concession / restroom building,
- ✓ Children's Play Area with shade sails and fall surfacing which meets ADA compliance,
- ✓ Adult Exercise Area with shade sails and court surfacing,
- ✓ Basketball courts,
- ✓ Walking / running paths,
- ✓ Benches and tables; and,
- ✓ Open space and warm up area turf and irrigation.



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Proposed in the North Expansion Area in a community building which will provide community rooms for meetings, activities and events. This building could also serve as a facilities for tournament events.

Proposed within the SCE Easement Area, the following features and facilities will be provided:

- ✓ 26' wide crushed stone road/path,
- ✓ 15' wide crushed stone path; and,
- ✓ Irrigated turf open space.

Located between fields one and the SCE open space turf and trails, a crushed stone parking area with a fire truck access road.

Along the western edge of the park, adjacent to the horse trail eight camping spots are proposed. These camping spots will include parking accommodations for horse trailers and a second vehicle. A horse paddock is proposed in each of the camping spots. Each camping spot would include water and electrical hook ups.

North of the Noble Creek Park Equestrian Center an equestrian parking facility designed to accommodate truck and horse trailers and smaller vehicles is shown. A drop off loop is illustrated for horse drop off and equestrian vehicle drop off.

At the existing children's play area, fall surfacing up grades along with hardscape and shade sail improvements are proposed. An Adult Exercise area would be created adjacent to the play area. Fall surfacing and concrete flat work would be implemented to assure ADA accommodation. Benches will be located to allow seating adjacent to the play area.

Next to the RC Park additional parking will be provided. This parking area will serve the open space it abuts, the RV Park, Field seven, the play area and dog park. Paths and lights would be added to the open space area. Open space area improvements will include irrigation upgrades, turf renovations and crushed stone paths.

Expansions proposed for the Noble Creek Community Center will include the expansion of office space, expansion to the building adjacent to the cooper room and the addiction of a community room. Site improvements to the area adjacent to the community center will include additional parking, flatwork and pathways.

Other proposed master plan improvements include the addition of walking trails, dog park fencing, the addition of trees, and slope planting.



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The approved master plan shows a variety of multi-use paths, path/maintenance roads, walking equestrian paths and trial connections. The plan provides for park perimeter paths and internal paths, this mix of paths / trails are part of pathway system which can be connected to the trails systems of the County of Riverside, Beaumont, Banning and Calimesa. The trail system includes 26' wide crushed stone path / SCE Vehicle road, 15' wide walking / hiking / running paths.

08 Proposed Cherry-Valley Grange Improvements

Established in (date) the Cherry-Valley Grange has and continues to serve the citizens of the park district as a hub of social, educational, civic and recreational activities. The federalist architectural characteristics of this historic building support its landmark status. The grounds around the Grange provide an outdoor setting to host events.

Future endeavors by the district to reaffirm and expand the historic designation of the Grange will continue its service to the community as a gathering and event venue. As the district moves forward with capital improvements; accessibility accommodations which are fitting to the historic nature of the Grange will need to be addressed, food warming and serving features should be updated and other general repairs and maintenance will need to be addressed. The addition of parking will improve the ease by which users can access the facilities. The ability of the Grange grounds to host events can be enhanced and improved by the addition of a gazebo of pavilion, planting of a shrub border along the fence. The addition and or upgrade of outdoor electrical service as well as the addition of lighting can broaden and enhance the Grange gardens as an activity area.

A key factor to expanding the ability for the Grange to serve the community in a greater capacity will be the acquisition of property adjacent to the facility for additional parking.

09 <u>Proposed Women's Club Improvements</u>

Founded in the Beaumont Womens Club building has served the community as a hub for social, artistic, educational and cultural events. The Womens Club continues to serve as a community center for Beaumont, providing meals, holding classes and events. Historic and architectural history and qualities of this building make a significant part for the Beaumont architectural vernacular.

Existing ADA accommodations have been done in a manner which does not detract from the building in a significant way. Changing hand rails to something which more in the flavor of the buildings architecture while meeting ADA will help to better support the buildings history.

The most significant disadvantage the Womens Club has is a lack of parking. Currently parking for the building is limited to a few parking spots behind the building and on street parking. To take better advantage of the Womens Club Facility the district will need to acquire property near by which can become a parking facility for the building. ADA parking should be developed within the limited parking area at the back of the building.

10 <u>Alternative Design Solutions</u>

<u>Field One – Tournament Field Upgrade</u>

This alternative proposes the reconfiguration of and reorientation of field one. This reconfiguration of field one would result in the development of a tournament field. The reconfiguration of field one will leave the field light pole in place, ball field fencing, backstops, dugouts and bleachers will be repositioned to create a tournament field.

North Expansion Ball Field Cluster

The north expansion ball field cluster alternative proposes a four field configuration with a center plaza core. In conjunction with the ball field cluster a restroom / concession building would be at the center of the plaza. Near the fields a picnic pavilion and children's play area will be constructed.

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11 <u>Capital Improvement Funding Needs</u>
